

- 10 Branch outlined in Article One of the Constitution
- 11 The new social contract created by the Second Continental Congress in November of 1777
- 12 The first state to ratify the Constitution
- 13 System of government in which people elect representatives to govern them

- 1 His sage advice helped resolve many disputes at the Constitutional Convention
- 3 Only state to not send representatives to the Constitutional Convention
- 4 The representative from Connecticut who offered a compromise for the large and small states
- 7 Clause that allows Congress to make and carry out responsibilities that are not enumerated
- 8 His New Jersey Plan represented the interests of the smaller states
- 9 System of government in which power is divided between the national and state governments, with the national laws being supreme

- 15 Location of a meeting between representatives
 - from VA and MD in 1785 to resolve a commerce dispute
- 16 Location of a failed meeting to discuss the Articles of Confederation, but plans were laid for Philadelphia
- 21 The group in favor of ratifying the Constitution after it had been adopted at the convention
- 25 Branch outlined in Article Three of the Constitution
- 27 A representative from PA at the Constitutional Convention who played an important role in shaping the document
- 29 System of government that has a weak national government and power concentrated at the states level
- 30 An example of this Constitutional principle is found in the opening line of the Constitutional
- 31 Article that describes the amending process for the Constitution
- 32 Life, liberty, and property
- 33 An author of the Federalist Papers who would become the first Chief Justice of the Supreme Court
- 34 Served as the President of the Constitutional Convention

- 14 The major issuing dividing the smaller and larger states at the Constitutional Convention
- 15 The "architect" of the Constitution
- 17 A group of 85 essays written in support of ratifying the Constitution
- 18 This important process is clearly described in Article Seven of the Constitution
- 19 Pseudonym used by the authors of the Federalist Papers
- 20 Group who demanded a Bill of Rights be added to the Constitution
- 22 Branch outlined in Article Two of the Constitution
- 23 Each individual agrees with others to create and live under a government and give it the power to make and enforce laws
- 24 City that hosted the Constitutional Convention in 1787
- 26 The willingness to set aside personal interests for the good of the community
- 28 Government by the people
