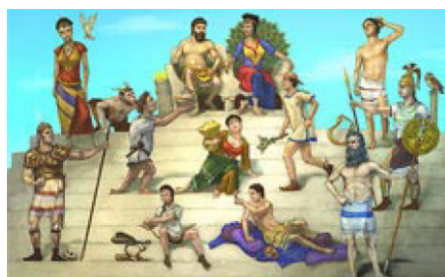

Mythology Project: THE PANTHEON (OLYMPIAN GODS): A FAMILY AFFAIR

You will be researching the Greek Pantheon to create a family tree using the free online family tree creator, www.familyecho.com. You will need to create a family tree that includes *all* the Greek gods from our book and notes. Your family tree will begin with **Cronus and Rhea**. You will need to include at least one works cited page entry that you used to help you create your family tree. Please carefully read the directions in this project to see how to

manipulate FamilyEcho. You will have _____ and _____ in class; any additional time you need *must* be done as homework. If you have extra time, you can add to your Greek Gods Family Tree (there are many demi-gods, heroes, etc. that various gods and goddesses gave birth to) for an additional **25 points extra credit**, dependent on the effort given to the project. Please check the rubric for how I will be grading this project.

FAMILY ECHO DIRECTIONS

Please read the following directions carefully for tips, tricks, etc. on how to use Family Echo (<http://www.familyecho.com>), the website you will be using to create your Family Tree. You are required to create a family tree for the Greek Gods' Pantheon (all the gods from the notes we took in class). If you would like up to 25 points extra credit, you can add more gods, goddesses, demi-gods, heroes, etc. to your family tree or add creativity to your printed project (for example, you can add pictures). Extra credit will be awarded based on effort.

Step One (Website):

- Go to <http://www.familyecho.com> and you will see the following screen (arrows and information added by me):

Step Two (Adding a Name):

- Let's add our first name! Start with **Cronus** or **Rhea**, as they are the parents of the original Olympians.
- In the "Personal" box at the right, type the god's name.
- Make sure their gender is selected. You don't need to change anything else.

- After adding Cronus, he should automatically appear on your "canvas" area, looking something like this:

Step Three (Creating a Marriage):

- Once you add Cronus, it's time to add Rhea. Click on the Cronus box on your "canvas" and then click on "Add partner/ex" button.
- New buttons will appear. Click on "Add new partner" and a new box will appear in your "canvas" area, connected to Cronus.
- Now add **Rhea's** name, following the directions from "Step Two."

Once you press "OK," Rhea should appear on your "canvas" area attached to Cronus and pink, to show she's female! It will look something like this:

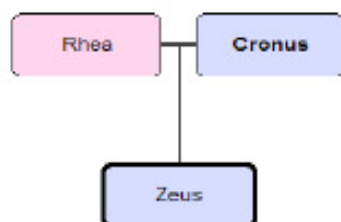

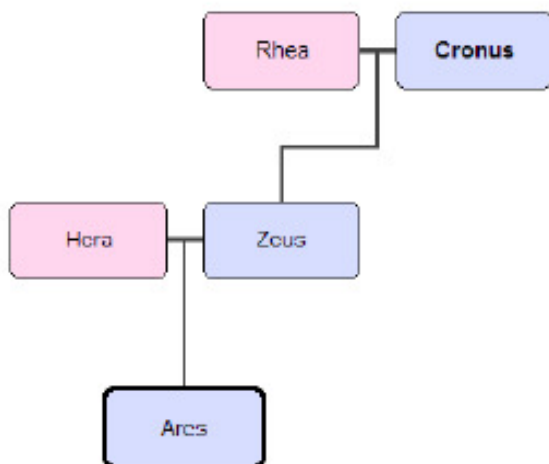
Step Four (Creating Children Relationships):

- Now, let's add **children**! Well, Rhea and Cronus had Zeus, so let's start there.
- Click on Rhea (or Cronus) and click on the button "Add child." When more buttons appear, click on "Add child with Cronus." (**Note:** in the future, the other options become handy when you are trying to add children that a god/goddess *did not* have with their spouse. For example, Aphrodite was *not* Hera's child, but was Zeus's).
- Put in the correct information like you did with Step Two, but this time add **Zeus's** name. If you do it correctly, you should have the following chart:



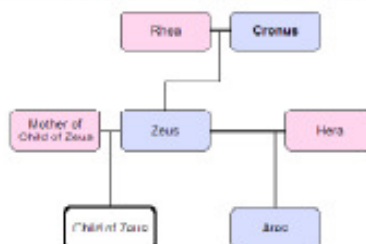
Step Five (Creating Illegitimate Children):

- So, how do you add the children that Zeus or another god/goddess had outside of wedlock? Let's add Artemis, an illegitimate child of Zeus's from an affair with Leto. By now, you probably have a chart that looks something like this:

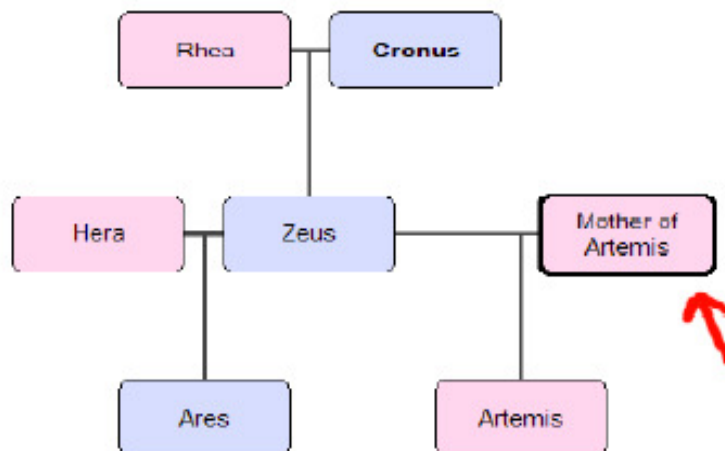


- Click on "Zeus," then click on the "Add Child" button. However, when the new buttons appear, click on "Add child with new mother."

- Now, two boxes should appear; one connected to Zeus, for the new mother, and one for the child:



- The child will come first, so let's enter Artemis's name and gender, then click OK.
- Now, it's time to enter a mother for Artemis. Click on the pink box that is currently titled "Mother of Artemis."



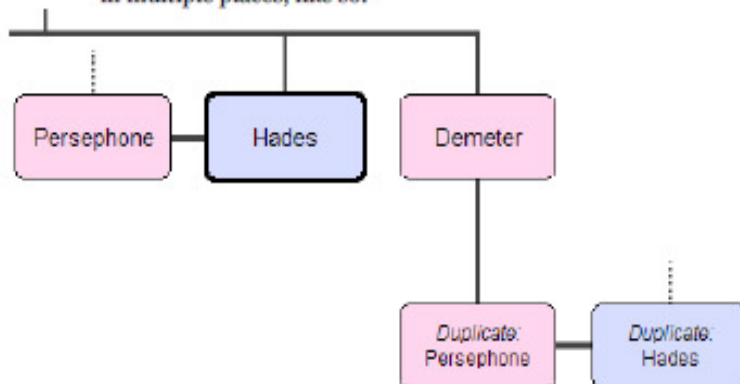
- Enter Leto's name, and it will pop up on the "canvas," but you'll notice that Leto is off by herself, connected to Zeus but separated.

- The line connecting Hera and Zeus will be darker, since they are husband and wife.

- You can keep going like this until you have all the branches in the family tree!

Step Six (Relationships within Relationships):

- In order to show a relationship with a god/goddess already on the Family Tree, the program will *duplicate* the names in multiple places, like so:



- To duplicate relationships, simply click on the person who will be marrying someone already in the family tree (for example, Hades), then click on the button "Add Partner/Ex." Finally, click on the new button "Partner with person already on the tree."



From the drop down menu that appears, choose the correct god/goddess, then "add as current partner" or "add as ex-partner" (if it was an affair).

Step Seven (Saving):

- If you do not finish in-class and want to work on the project at home, it's very easy to save and do so—all you need is an email address and an internet connection at home!
- Click on the "Sign in" button, and then to create an account, follow the directions.

Step Eight (Printing):

- In order to print, even if you're just emailing it to me, you will need to click on the "print" link at the bottom of the page.
- On the left hand side, fill out the **TITLE** of your family tree (i.e. "Greek Gods Family Tree") but include "by YOUR NAME", making sure to have your own name in the title! **You will lose 5 points of your total project score if you do not have your name in the title!**
- Keep everything else the same, then click on "Download PDF."
- Open the PDF file once it's done downloading, then **resave it into "My Documents" folder**, so it's easy to find!
- You can now **print** the document or **email** it to me
