## **Parental/Guardian Permission Slip**

Dallastown JROTC program. I understand that JROTC is an elective offered at
Dallastown High School and by enrolling in this class, my child will be required to
participate in the following activities unless deemed incapable due to a documented
medical condition:
1. Physical fitness program
2. Regularly scheduled close order drill and personnel inspections
3. Marksmanship program (air rifles)
Additionally, all students will have the opportunity to participate in numerous community
and school activities, field trips off the school campus, and drill, air rifle, and physical
fitness competitions.
As the parent/guardian of the student it is understood that each student in JROTC must be
covered by adequate medical insurance. This insurance should cover any and all injuries
that may occur on/off the school campus while participating in a JROTC activity.
It is understood that the following regulations govern participation in the JROTC
program:
1. Every student must have a current physical upon joining the program.
2. Every student must maintain appropriate grooming standards as specified in the
Cadet Handbook and by the JROTC instructors.
3. The student will be encouraged to participate in parades or other activities deemed appropriate by the JROTC instructors.
4. The failure of the student to maintain good order, discipline, and attendance in the
JROTC program, and with the school in general, will result in counseling,
parental contact, and potential removal from the JROTC program if improvement
is not apparent.
5. All students in JROTC are required to wear the appropriate Marine Corps issued
uniform at least once a week (Thursdays) and are responsible for its care,
cleaning, and return at the end of the academic year or departure from the
program.
It is further understood that enrollment in the JROTC program is voluntary and does
not constitute any obligation to the United States government or any other agency for
service upon graduation.
