

Motto (which is Italian for "word"): a short expression of a guiding principle.

Most mottoes are statements of faith or advice, which are serious in nature. Others are humorous thoughts to remind us not to take ourselves too seriously.

When displayed, the motto normally appears on a scroll or ribbon beneath the shield (the supporters stand on this ribbon). The exception is for Scottish Armorials where it usually appears on a ribbon above the top of the crest. In rare instances where more than one motto has been adopted, they are often both displayed above the crest, or one above the crest and one below the shield. When two ribbons are present, one might contain the name of the bearer of the arms while the other contains the motto.
